#### 1. Can I save reports?

Yes, you can save reports. There are different ways in which to save your report. You can save the parameters you used to run the report. You can also export your report as an Excel spreadsheet, PDF, or other formats. Please refer to the Working with Report Parameters or the Downloading and Printing Reports job aids.

## 2. How do you print a report?

To print a report, you will export it to PDF and then print the PDF. For more information, please refer to the Downloading and Printing Reports job aid.

#### 3. Can I bookmark reports that I run frequently?

Reports that you run frequently can be bookmarked. You can find your bookmarked reports in the Bookmarks section of the Navigation pane.

Additionally, you can run your bookmarked reports using your saved Report Parameter Sets. For more information, please refer to the job aids Bookmarking Reports and Working with Report Parameters.

#### 4. Can I save my report configuration?

Yes, you can. Questica refers to your report configuration as your Report Parameter Set. To learn more, see the job aid Working with Report Parameters.

#### 5. Can I create my own reports?

At this time, you cannot create your own reports. However, you may use any of the financial reports in the system.

## 6. Can I use the report selections from one report on another report?

No, you cannot use report selections from another report. However, you can save your report selections to use with the same report.

## GENERAL

#### 1. What is Questica?

Questica is a web-based system designed for budget information. It contains selected information from CFS. It allows you to run reports regarding your expense projections, fund balances, fund summaries, and more.

# 2. Does Questica reports look the same as the Finance Data Warehouse?

Questica reports look more like a financial report as opposed to a report with financial information. Text appearing in red and negatives means bad, as they do in most Accounting systems. In the future, Questica will allow you to request changes for operating and position budgets.

#### 3. Which system should I use for financial reporting?

You can use either the Finance Data Warehouse or the Questica Budget System for financial reporting. However, the financial reports in Questica are easier to read and understand.

#### 4. Which system has the most current information?

The Common Finance System (CFS) is our primary financial system. It is the system where our financial data is entered and stored. It is the system of record for all financial data. Therefore, it will have the most current information.

#### 5. Is the Finance Data Warehouse going away?

No, there is no plan to decommission the Finance Data Warehouse. You can continue to use it.

#### 6. What other campuses use Questica?

Questica is currently used at 4 CSU campuses. CSU Northridge, San Luis Obispo, CSU Humbolt, and CSU Bakersfield. Plans are in progress to add more campuses in the future. designed specifically for the CSU. The 28 reports fall into 3 categories: Expense Projection, Fund Balance, and Fund Summary

## 2. What are the Expense Projection reports?

The Expense Projection reports show your expenses and projected expenses for a specific fiscal year. These reports can be run at 6 levels: Campus, Business Unit, Fund, Division, College / Area, Department, and Department Program Project Class.

## 3. How do I find out my fund Balances?

The Fund Balance reports show your fund balances including total revenues, total expenses, and transfers in/out for a specific fiscal year. These reports can be run for at levels for campus, business unit, fund, division, college area (school) / area, and department.
